



### **COMPOST PIT**

Compost-making is a vital, life-saving opportunity to save waste and turn it into productive use.Compost is made from mixing together organic waste materials-such as leaves, weed and straw-and leaving them to decompose until a black, crumbly soil is formed. The materials needed to make it are locally available, accessible and free.

Mature compost helps plants to grow better. It enriches soil, which loses nutrients to food-hungry plants. By using compost, people can grow more vegetables and trees to feed themselves. Composting simply copies nature's ways. Leaves fall from trees, plants grow and die and the natural cycle of decay returns nutrients to the soil. Many people know about compost, but they don't take time to make it in an organized way. Many farmers instead rely on chemical fertilizers. However, these are expensive and do not improve soil structure.

### 1.Dig a hole or trench for the compost pit.

Find an open space where you can comfortably dig a hole or trench—someplace near an existing (or future) flower/vegetable garden is a great option. Make your pit between 12 and 15 in (30.5 to 38 cm) deep and 8 to 10 in (20 to 25 cm) wide. Depending on your yard space, you can make the pit a singular hole or a longer trench.

(a)Feel free to make more than one hole or trench, depending on the amount of space you have to work with. Digging holes rather than trenches may be more manageable if you don't have a lot of compost material to discard.

(b)If you have fruit trees in your yard, consider digging compost pits beneath the outer edge of the branches. This placement allows the compost to nourish the tree's roots more efficiently.

**2. Chop your compost materials finely.** Slice or physically break down larger pieces of compost, like leftover chunks of vegetables. The morefine your compost is, the more efficiently it will decompose.Kitchen scraps can be ripped apart by hand, chopped with a knife, or even pulverized in a blender or food processor. Yard scraps can be broken down using a lawn mower. Aim for pieces no bigger than 2 to 3 in (5 to 8 cm) long, wide, and thick.

#### 3. Fill the bottom 4 in (10 cm) of the pit with compost.

Don't fill it up all the way—the majority of the compost pit will be filled with soil. If you end up having more compost than you expected, feel free to dig another hole or trench. Use a shovel to mix the materials together so that they decompose as evenly as possible. It's especially important to make sure your carbon-rich materials (such as paper and dried leaves) are mixed thoroughly with your nitrogen-rich materials (like vegetable scraps and fresh grass clippings). Well-mixed compost materials are important from the outset, as you generally do not turn the materials like you would with other kinds of compost setups.

#### 4. Cover up the compost with soil and mulch

Fill the pit until it is level with the surrounding soil. For a little extra protection, spread out some straw or other mulch over the pit. Seeding the area with grass or similar vegetation can also work well for this.

### 5. Wait a few months to 1 year for your pit to finish decomposing.

Unlike other composting methods (like "hot" composting), a compost trench requires several months (or even a year) to finish decomposing. In well-nourished, well-draining soil, your compost can be ready in as little as 2-3 months, but this isn't always the case.

If your soil is mineral-based and lacks good drainage, you might have to wait much longer for your compost to ready.

### 6.Grow plants above the compost pit when it has decomposed.

Your soil is now deeply enriched beneath the surface, which makes it perfect for your future landscaping and gardening needs. Plant your desired seeds and sprouts into the soil with the confidence that they'll be well-nourished.

### 7. Dig a new trench to prepare a new compost pit.

If you have plenty of other food scraps, dead leaves, and other materials ready to go, feel free to repeat the process all over again! Dig another hole or trench, fill it up, cover it with soil and mulch, and wait for the compost to decompose.

### **Problems Encountered During the Creation of a Compost Pit**

  - Solution: Avoid adding meat, dairy, and oily foods to the compost. Use a compost bin with a secure lid and consider adding a layer of soil or brown material on top to deter pests.

  - Solution: Maintain the moisture level so that the compost is as damp as a wrungout sponge. Add water during dry periods and mix in dry materials like straw or cardboard if the compost becomes too wet.
- 5. Material Breakdown:
  - Issue: Slow decomposition of materials can occur if the balance of compost ingredients is not correct.
  - Solution: Ensure a good mix of green and brown materials, chop or shred larger items to increase surface area, and turn the pile regularly to facilitate aeration and microbial activity.
- 6. Temperature Regulation:
  - Issue: Compost pile not heating up, which is essential for breaking down materials and killing pathogens.
  - Solution: Ensure a proper mix of materials, add enough green material to increase nitrogen, and regularly turn the compost to introduce oxygen and maintain microbial activity.
